





Reporting a Safeguarding Concern in the Netball Environment

Safeguarding young people in sport is vital to ensure they have a safe and positive experience. Whatever your role at a sports event, you should always report concerns you may have of any abuse or poor practice.

You are concerned a child or young person may be suffering abuse or is subject to poor practice.
 Make a note of anything you have seen, or what the young person has said, with dates and times and report

	Recognise a concern, or receive a direct disclosure.
	Reassure the individual and tell them what you will do
	Record All concerns and allegations - who, what, where and when
	Refer the Information to the safeguarding lead

Report your concerns to the Event Organiser and the EN Lead Safeguarding Officer. Give detail of the abuse or poor practice with dates and times

If the Club Safeguarding Officer is not available, refer the matter to the Lead Safeguarding Officer and the NSPCC can also advise on non-urgent cases.

The Lead Safeguarding Officer may refer the matter to the EN Safeguarding Case Management Group or external agencies
